The Scottish independence vote in September 2014 is a potential turning point in the United Kingdom's history. But it also raises a crucial and current question about the autonomy of Westminster and where and when it is correct to "cut the ties".

It should be of particular interest to those in regions such as Greater Manchester where there is an ongoing push for more and more delegated powers of our own, as evidence by our own City Deal.

It is for this reason that we should be behind devolution and let the Scots set an example of the good that can be done when we have greater power and control over our own destiny. But others will argue that the experiment is too young and it is far healthier to keep power structures – and therefore the nation – unified, finding ways to assert greater influence instead of greater control.
